OPTION 1: Assisting With Our February 18 State Election Housing Forum

Task	What Would Be Involved
Joining a City promo session + coffee catch-up	Be part of a team that does some letterboxing and postering, followed by a coffee and a chat afterwards
Teaming-up with an experienced activist to run our registration desk	Help greet forum attendees, check them in, and encourage them to get active
Recording a video message, immediately after the forum	Briefly (1-2 minutes) speak about why you came to the forum, what you heard, and your message for the political parties – we can give you some dot-points/questions to guide you
Taking notes and writing-up a report on the event, for our website/social media	Write a short (200 words) report on the forum covering: • What you heard from the candidates and the other speakers • The key messages from the forum • The things that surprised you • Your message to the political parties

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OPTION 2: Assisting With Our March 1 Housing Rally

Housing Rally being held on Sunday March 1, 12pm-2pm, at Parliament House, North Terrace, Adelaide.

Task	What Would Be Involved
Joining a City promo session + coffee catch-up	Be part of a team that does some letterboxing and postering, followed by a chat afterwards
Recording a video message, immediately after the rally	Briefly speak about why you came to the rally, what you heard, and your message for the political parties – we can give you some dot-points/questions to guide you
Being part of a working bee to prepare rally signs and props	Help us design and paint signs and props for our rally and come up with ideas for slogans and messages in a relaxed, friendly environment
Taking notes and writing-up a report on the event, for our website/social media	We are looking for some people who can write a short (200 words) report on the rally, covering : • What you heard from the speakers • The key messages from the rally • The things that surprised you • Your message to the political parties We will give you plenty of guidance

OPTION 3: Assisting With Our Voting Day Info Stall – March 21

On State Election voting day (Saturday March 21), we will be holding info stalls to distribute our housing scorecards and speak to community members about the housing crisis, and what we need.
